- Cultural and historical context of the brand and time period
- Connotations of colour
- Representation of gender
- Use of language. Who is the advert aimed towards and why?

Research the codes and conventions of the 'monster movie' film poster.

Make notes about compositions (layout), fonts, colour, representation of 'the monster' and (usually female) victims. The 'Universal Monsters' and 'Hammer Horror' productions would be a good place to start.

Research Hammer Horror films – minimum expectation is a side of A4 paper.

After completing your research, annotate two 'monster movie' posters.

Complete an analysis of the two posters (1000 words) which answers the question: Compare how well the two texts use the codes and conventions of the genre to create traditional 'movie monster' posters.

Optional

Watch the two set films in preparation for September:

- I, Daniel Blake (2016)
- Black Panther (2018)

Read a selection of same date issues of The Times and The Daily Mirror newspapers. Compare and make notes on how the same stories are reported.

Watch a variety of TV episodes from the sci-fi and supernatural genres. Keep a log, making notes about: themes, plot and representation of characters/gender.

Starting point:

- Humans (2015)
- Stranger Things (2016)
- Les Revenants (2012)
- Orphan Black (2013)

Be ready to show your notes and hand in your essay on the first lesson back after the holiday. Take yourselves seriously. This means viewing yourselves as young intellectuals, taking responsibility for your education, and coming prepared.
